

Charles G. Heiner was born July 7, 1864 in Michelfeld, Wurtenberg, Germany. Charles came to America in 1880 and worked in cities in the east four years. In 1884 he joined the United States Army for five years. He came to Star Valley in 1890 and settled in Bedford. Charles married Barbara Harrer and they were parents of four sons and a daughter. Charles built the first frame house in the Lower Valley. He was a school board trustee, Postmaster, Justice of the Peace and Notary Public. He was an active member of the LDS Church. His photographs were taken from glass plate negatives of pictures taken in Star Valley during the first part of the century. Charles Heiner died in 1948. All photos are from his collection.






