The Letterman's club is made up of boys who have earned letters and who are interested in sports. Their main goal is to promote better sportsmanship in the school and among the boys.



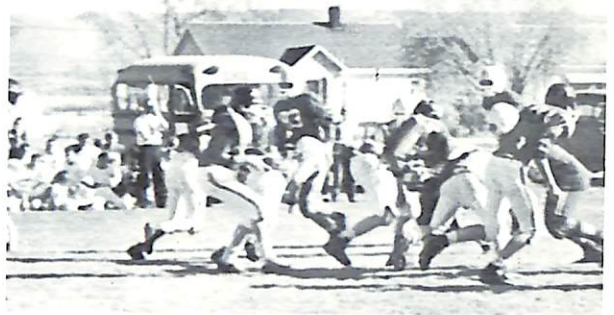
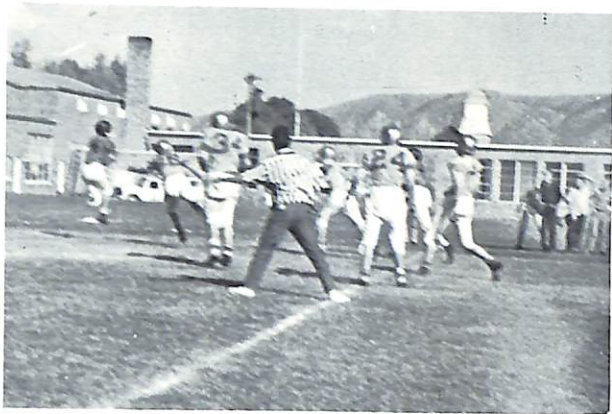

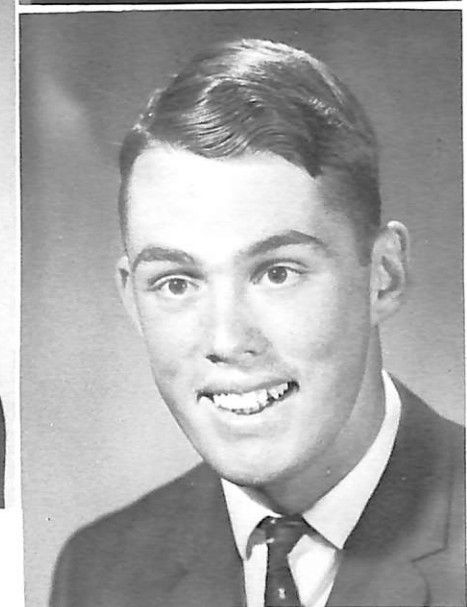


The seniors put on the exciting, suspenseful production of "Terror in the Suburbs." Their play was a big success and displayed one of the seniors' many talents.
