Lloyd C. Bender, Superintendent of the Cokeville School District from 1919-1944, was responsible more than any other person for the growth and improvement of the Cokeville Schools from almost primitive conditions to a highly effective and respected establishment.

Under his direction and planning five small county schools were eliminated, and a new high school and an elementary school were built, both of which are still providing good service to Cokeville students. This was followed not many years later by a new gymnasium. More land was purchased to enlarge the campus, and he planned the landscaping of the grounds, doing much of the work himself.

As an administrator, Mr. Bender had the advantage of being a highly skilled and versatile teacher himself, with lofty but attainable expectations of what education can accomplish. He was forceful, fair, and dedicated in all his dealings with faculty, students, and patrons, and he won the love and respect of all.

To the memory of this outstanding educator, to whom our school and community owe much, we dedicate this yearbook.

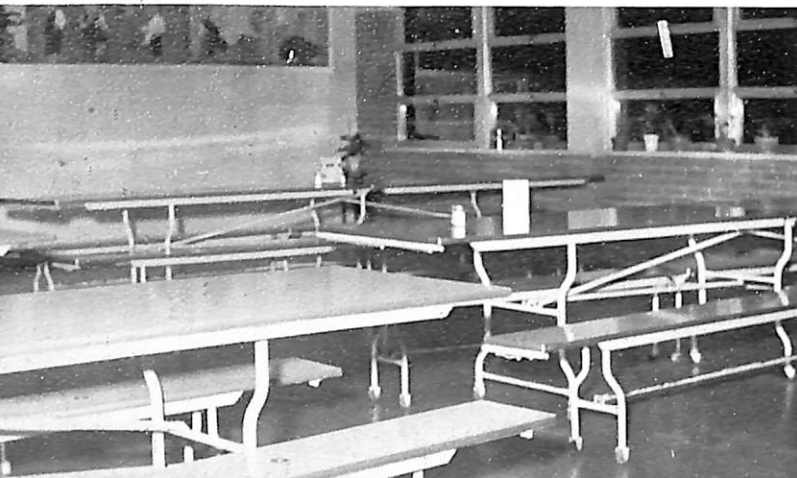
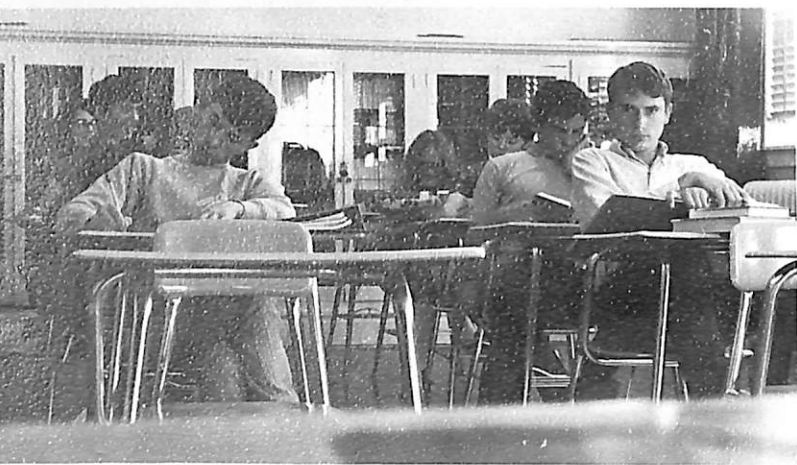

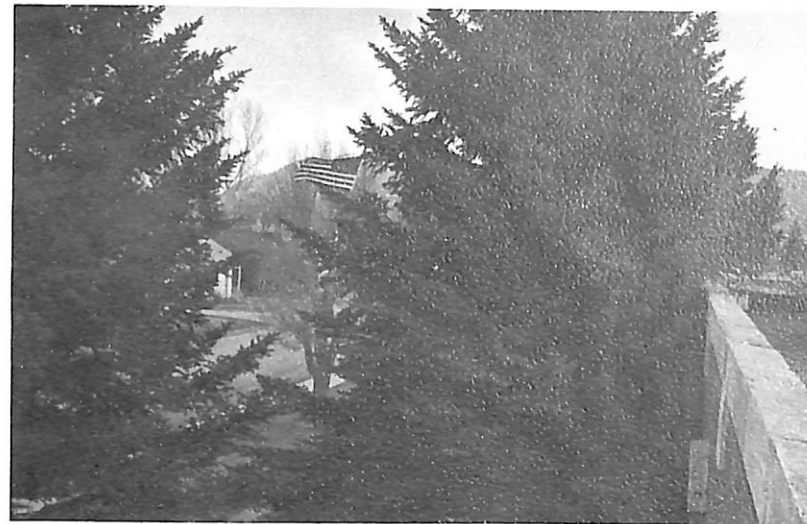

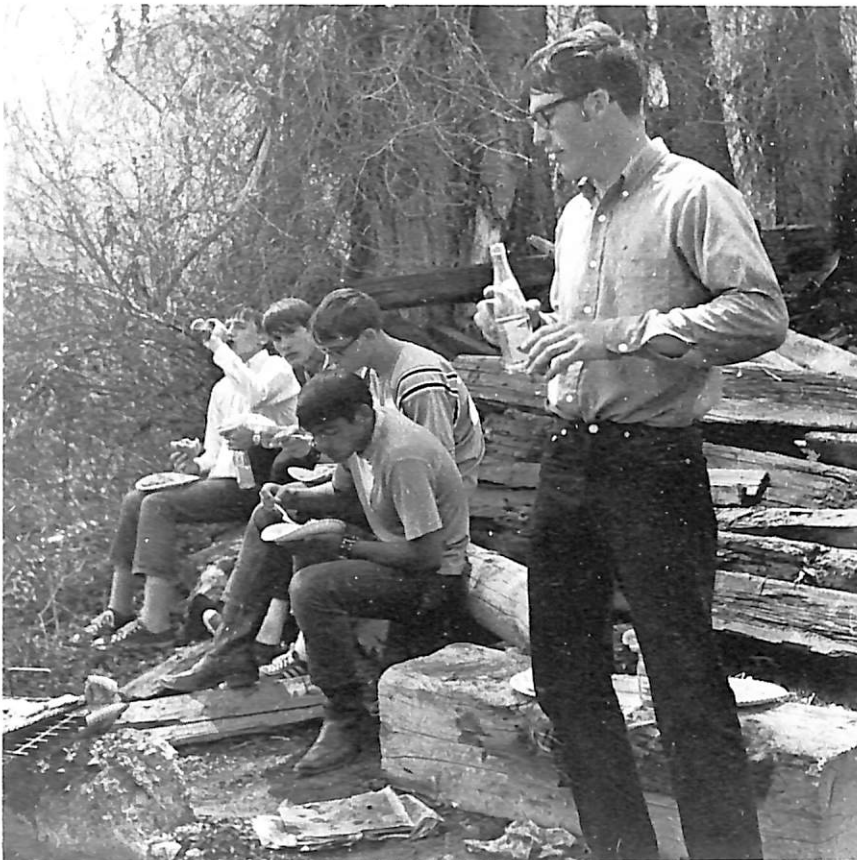

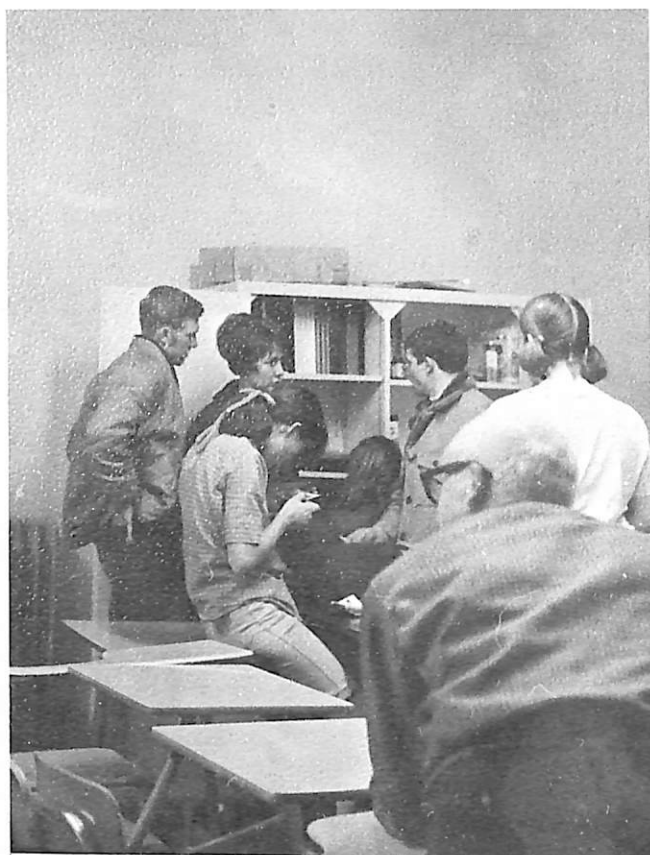
The purpose of the Student Council is to set dates for different school activities, arrange school parties, sponsor National School Assemblies and provide other services for the Student Body.

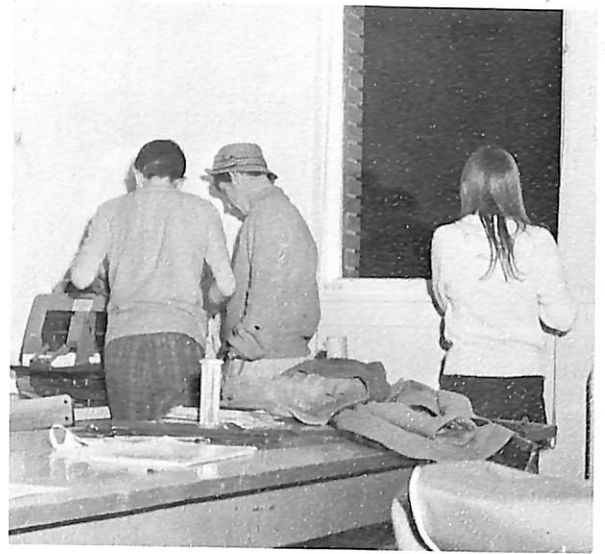

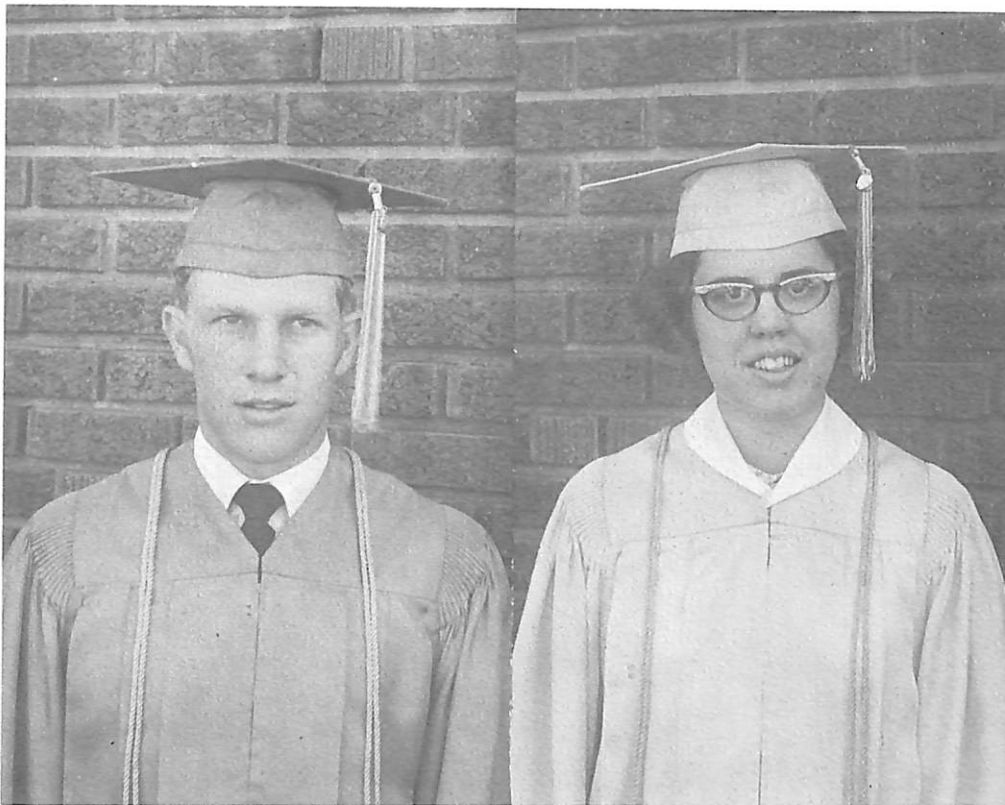

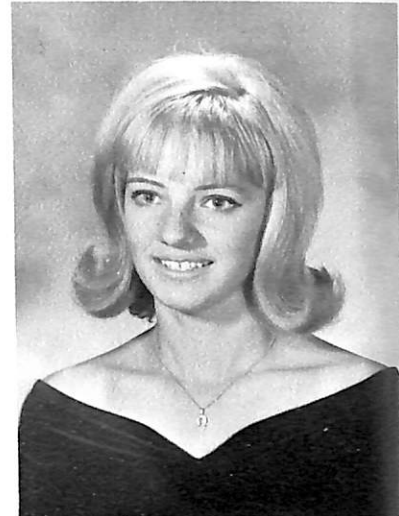
Seniors Officially Reach Adulthood

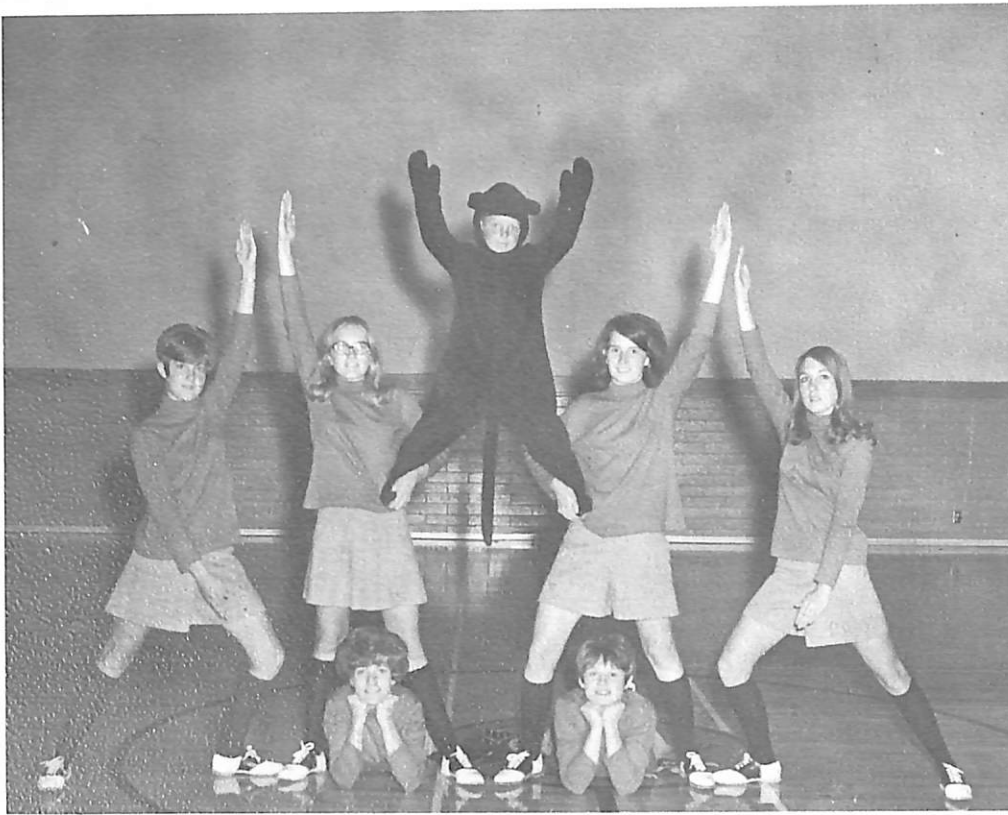

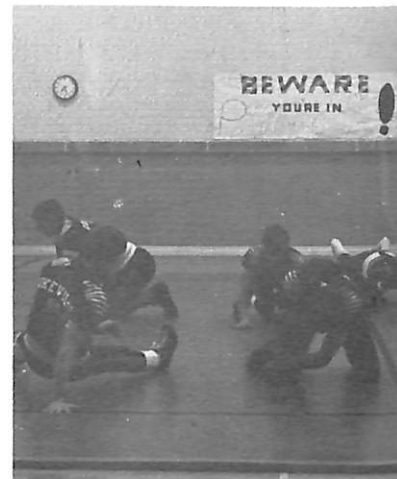

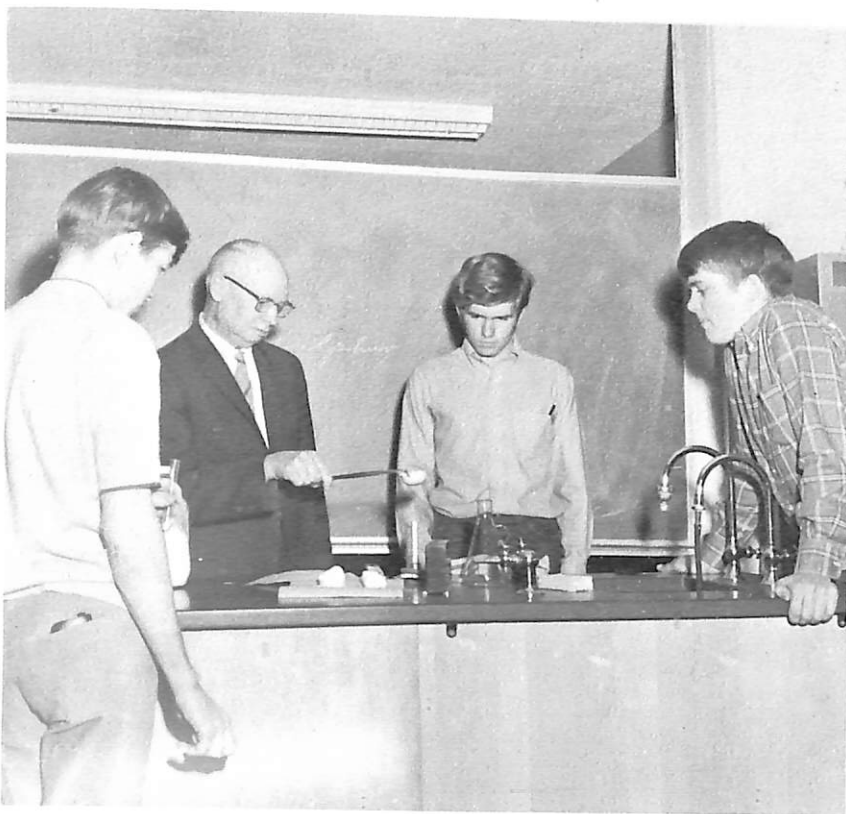
