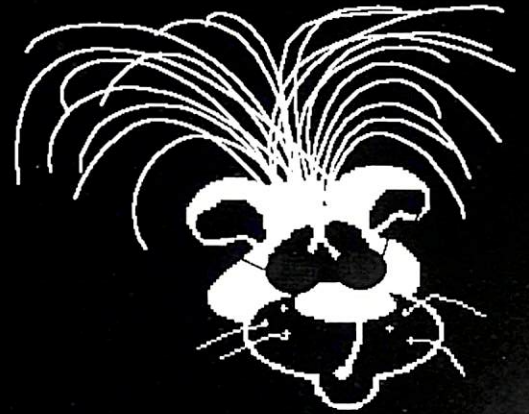

## PANTHERS PULL IT OFF!

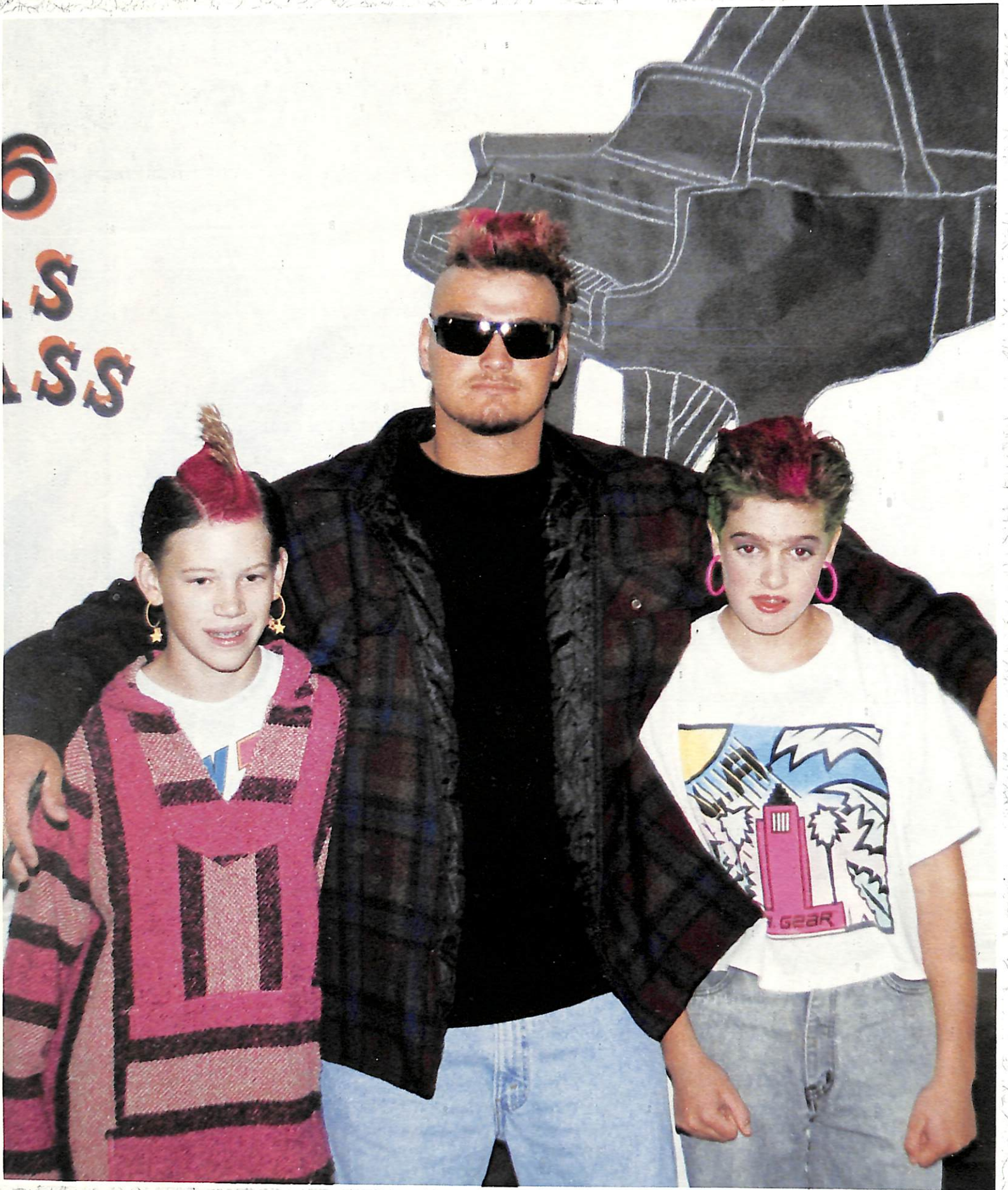

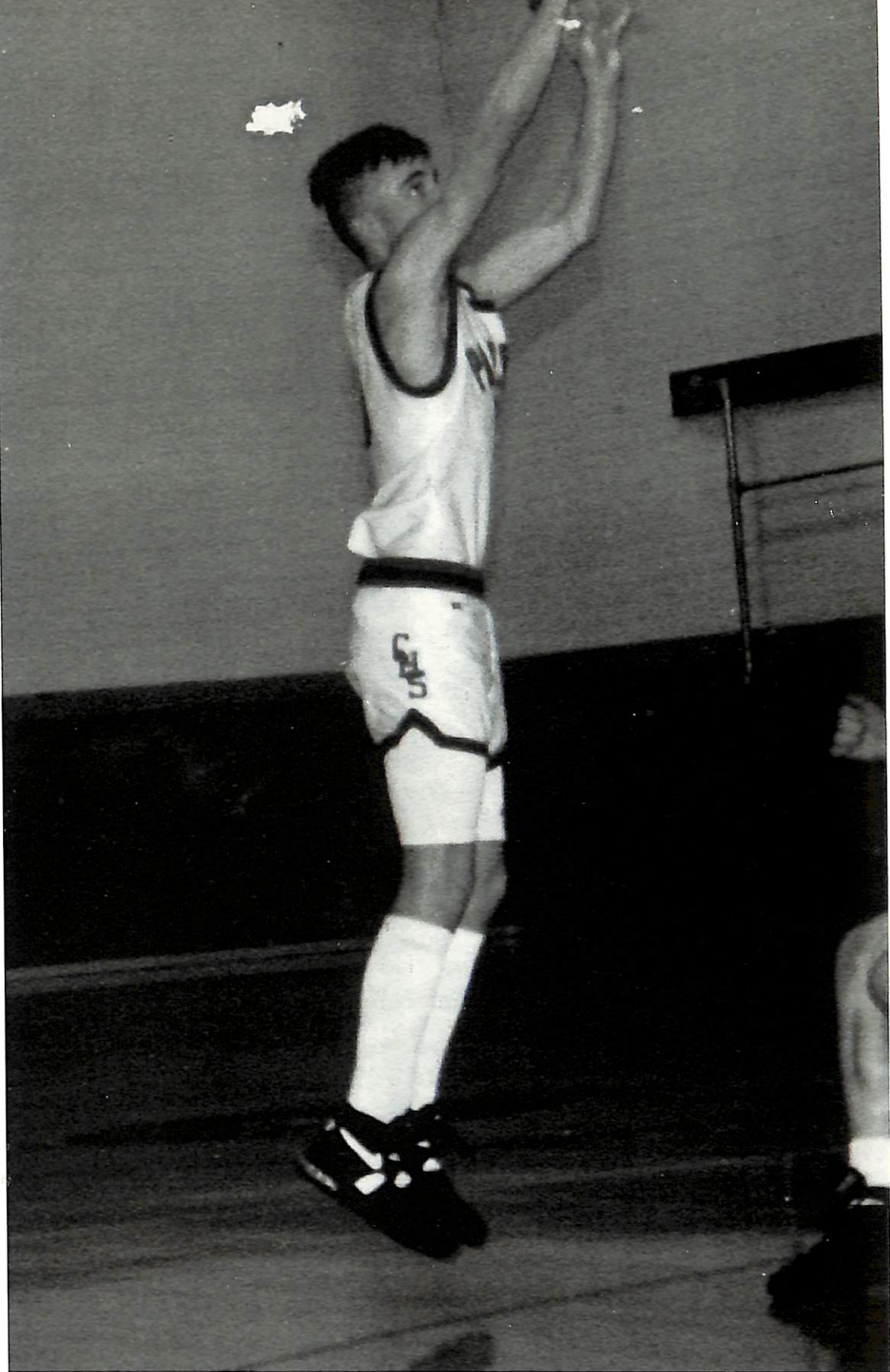

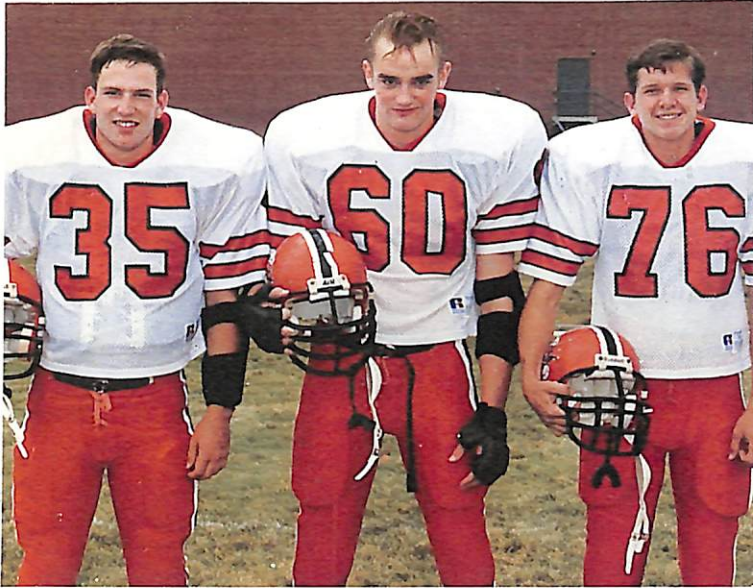

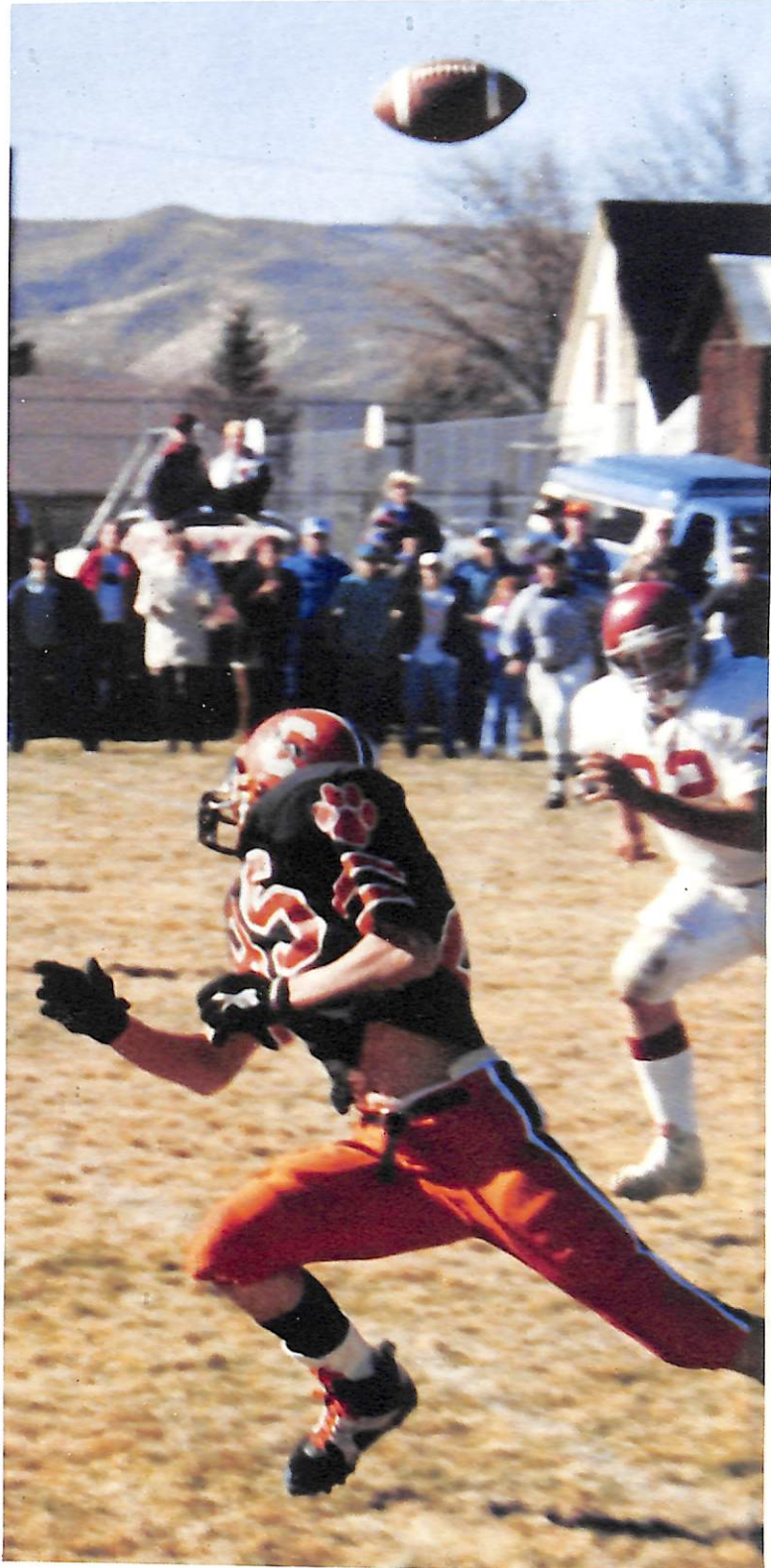

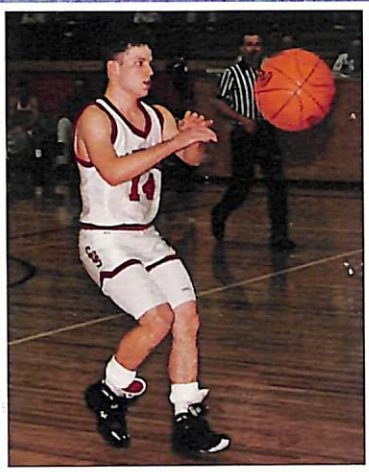
# Just Might Pull It Off!!

# J.V. WORKS HARD

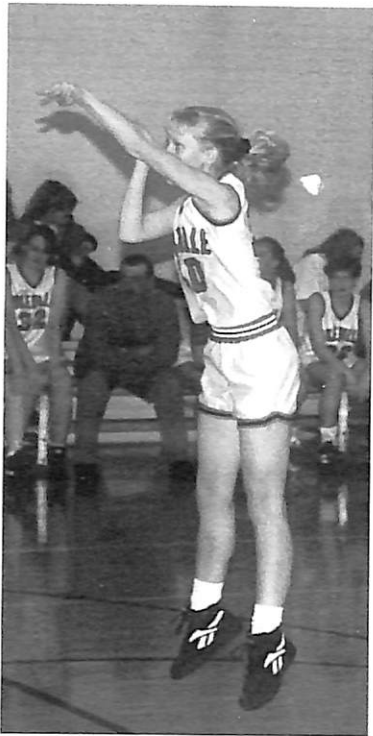

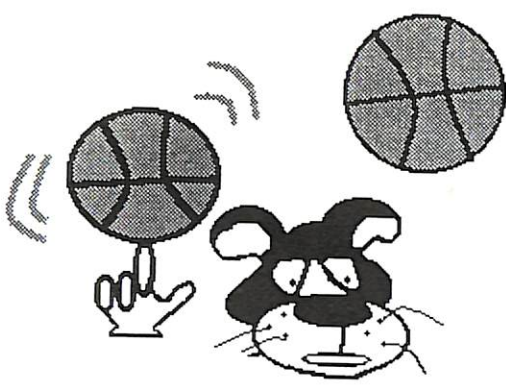

# Hard Work Pays Off

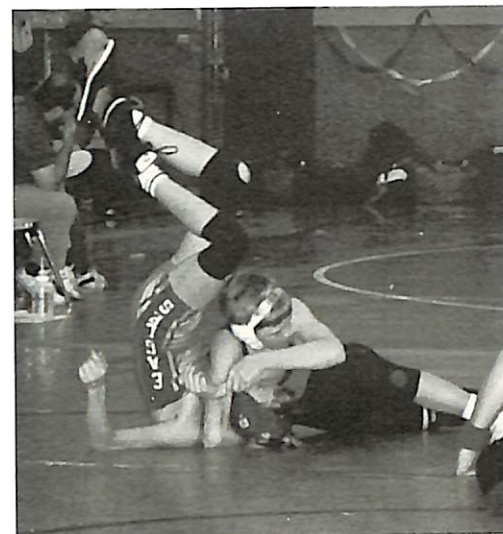
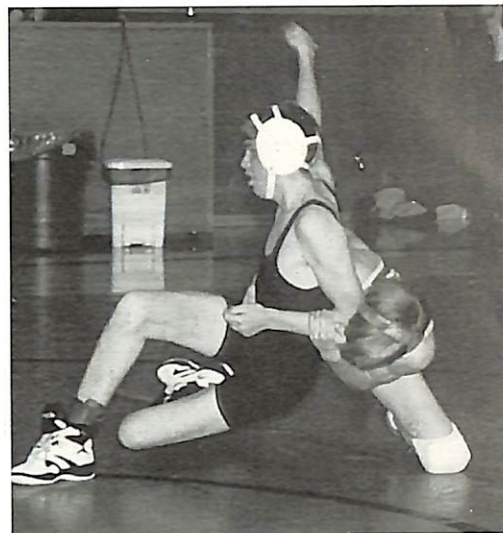

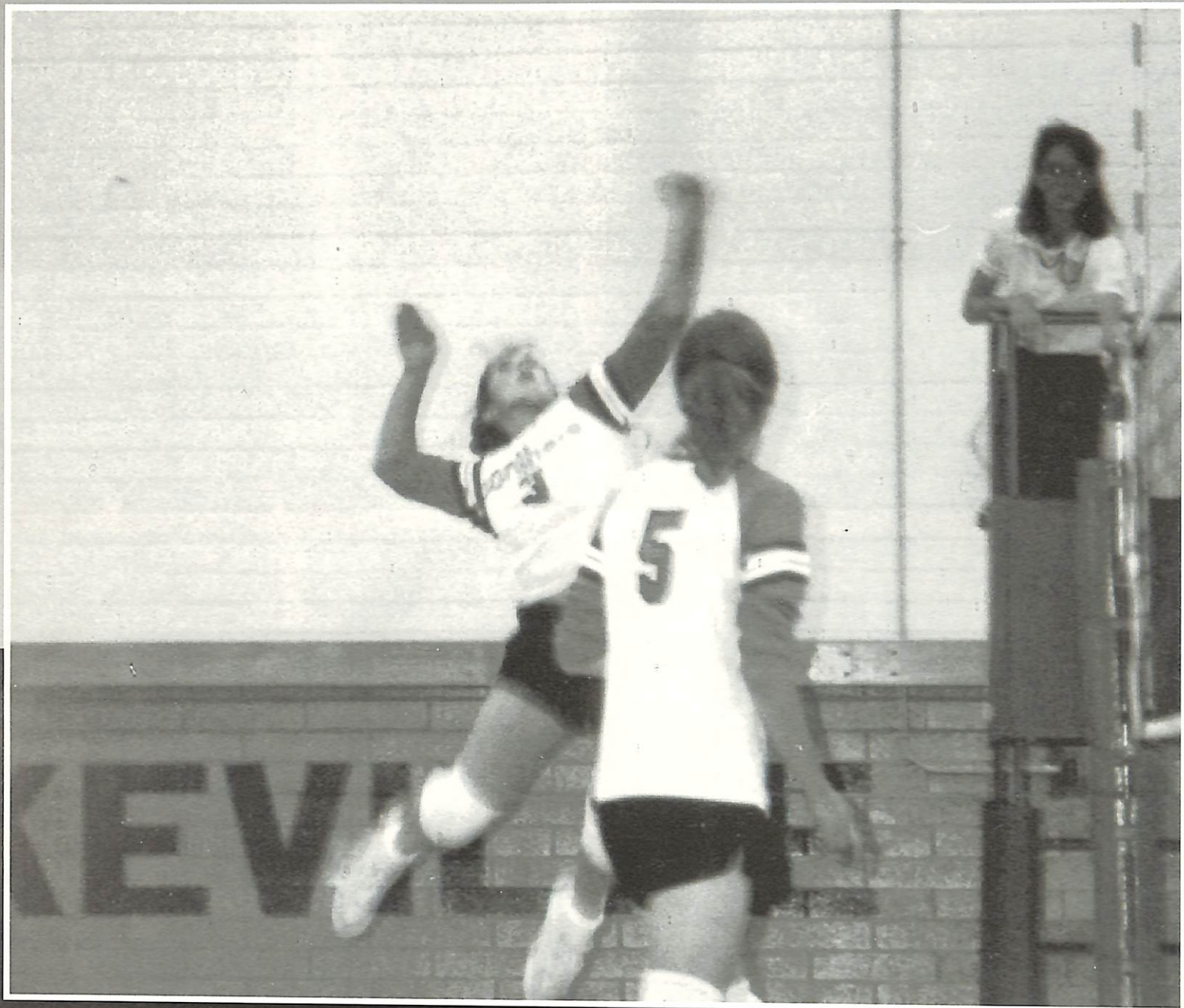

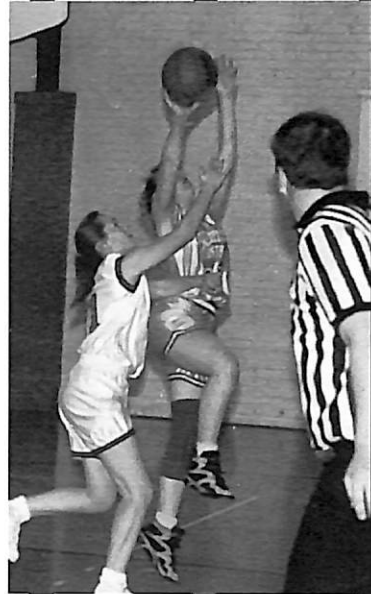
# Catch Us On A Winning Streak

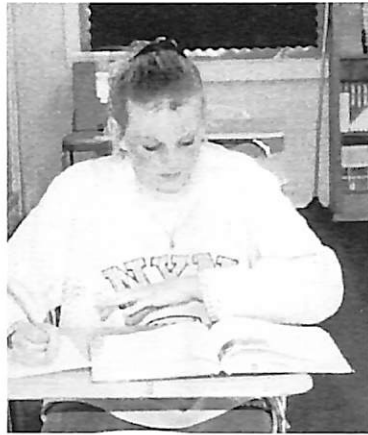
## English Dept. Gets New Teacher

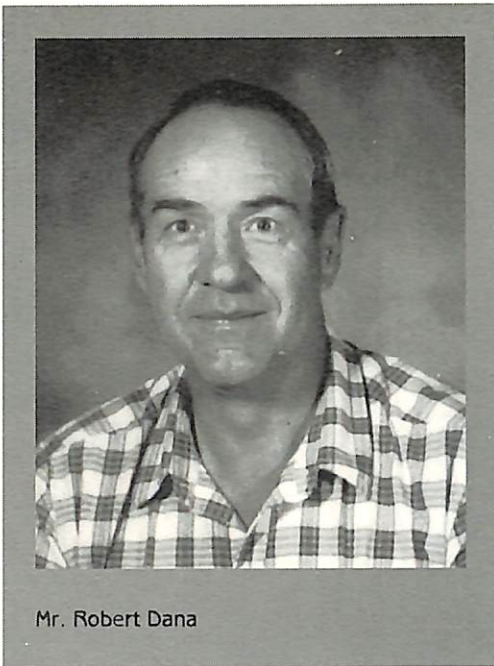


## *Library Gets New Research Technology*

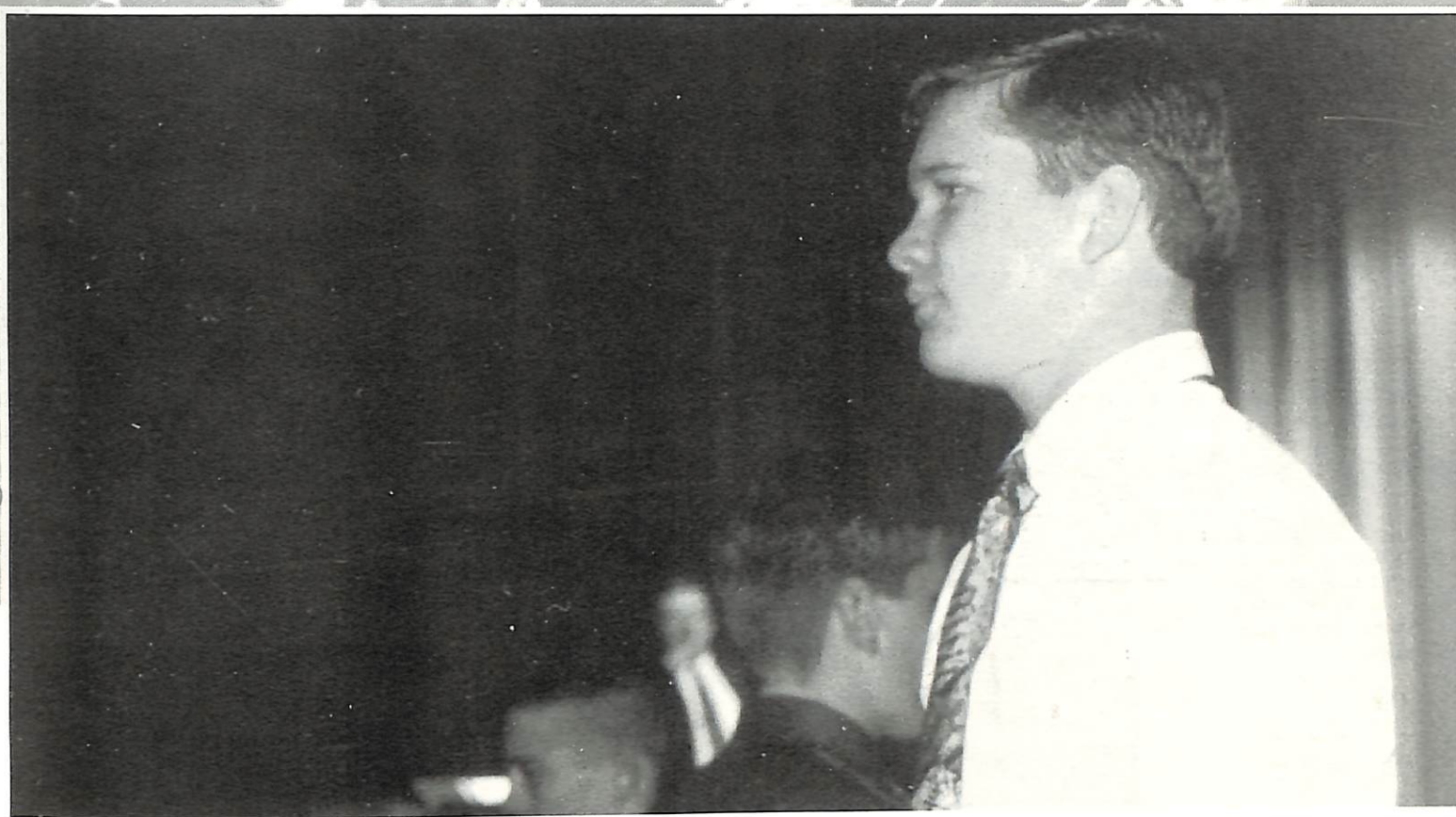

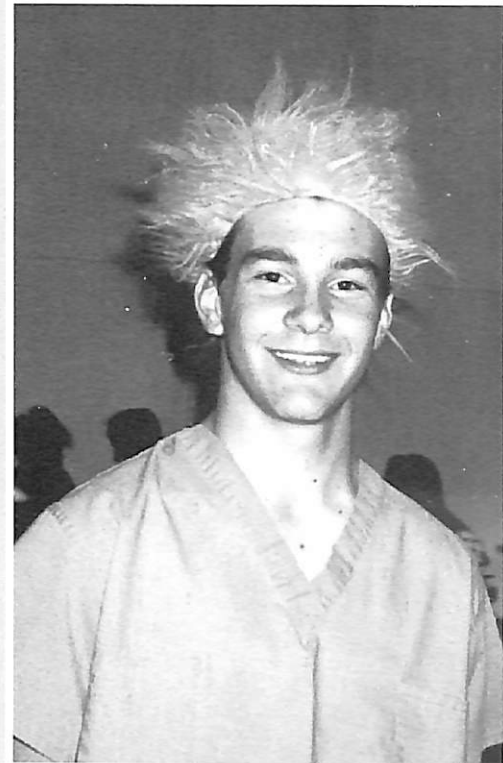
# CAN'T CATCH OUR HORSES!

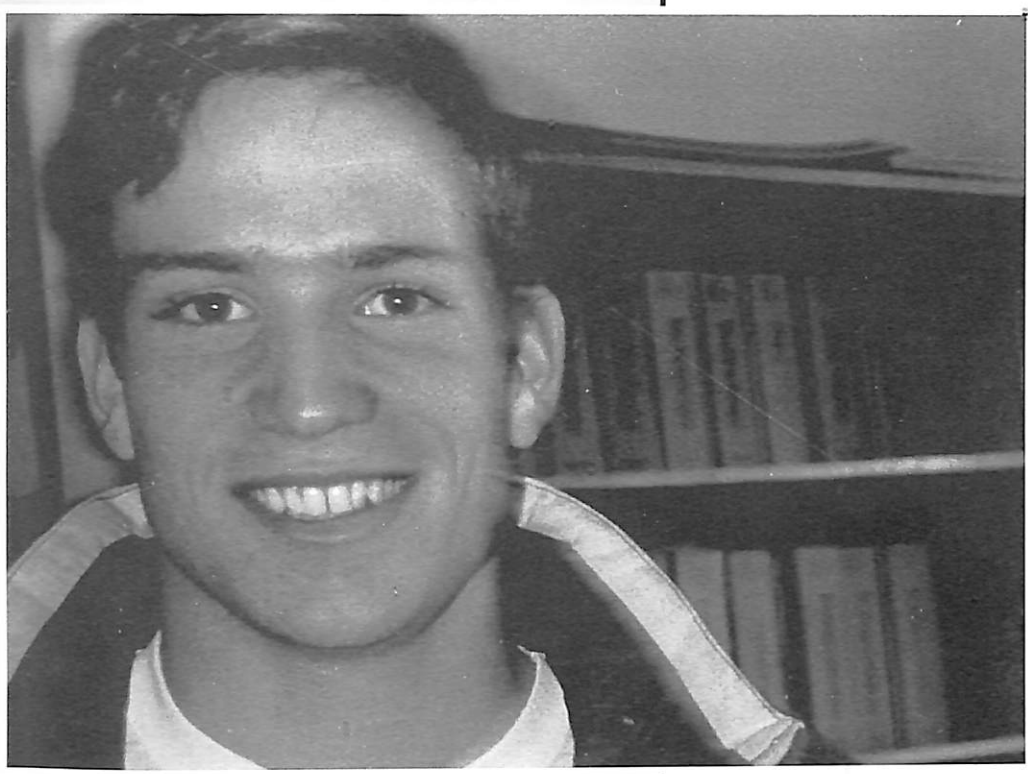

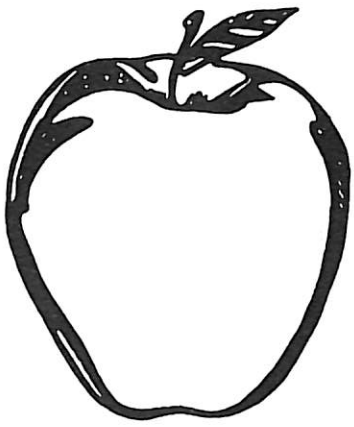

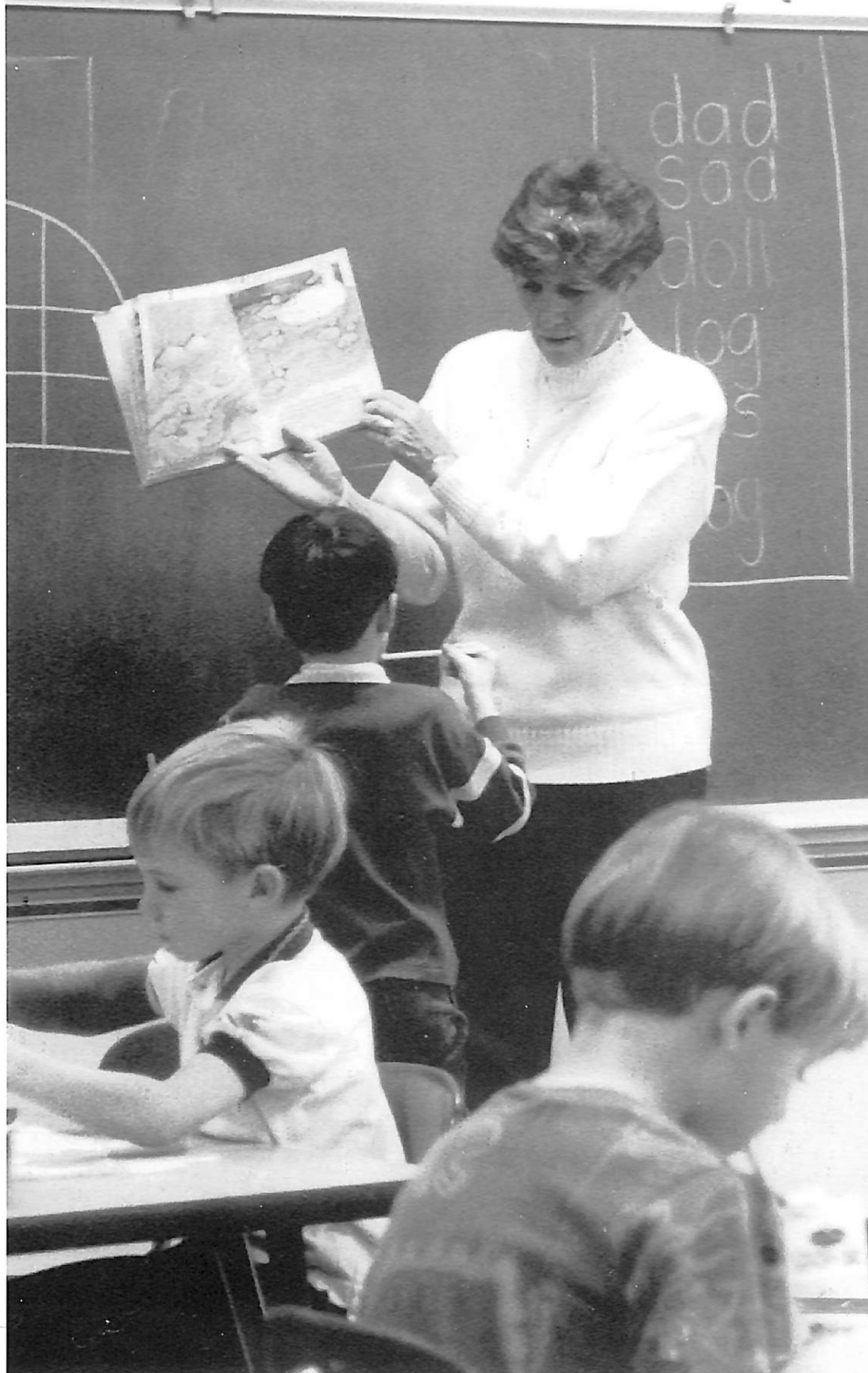

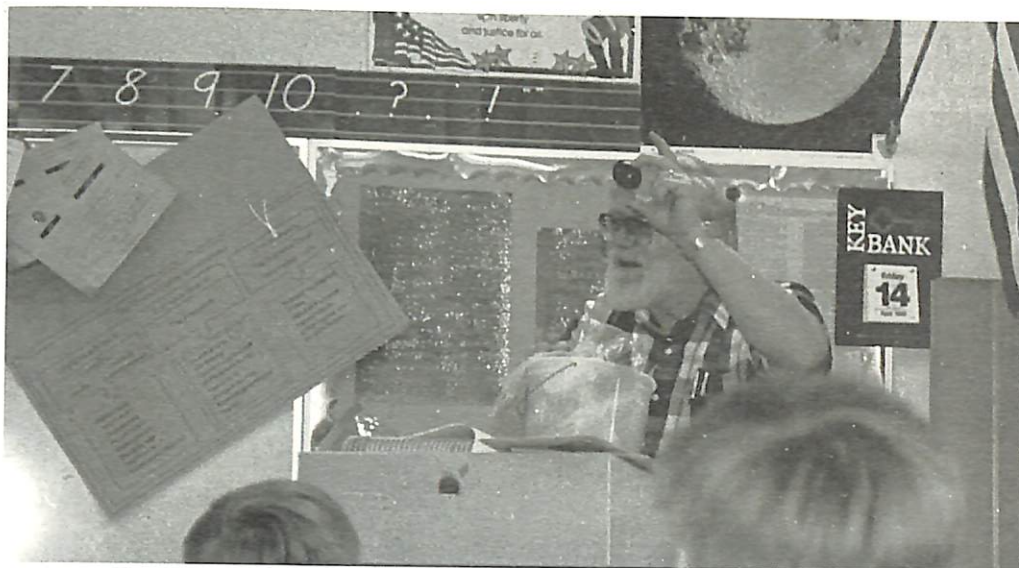

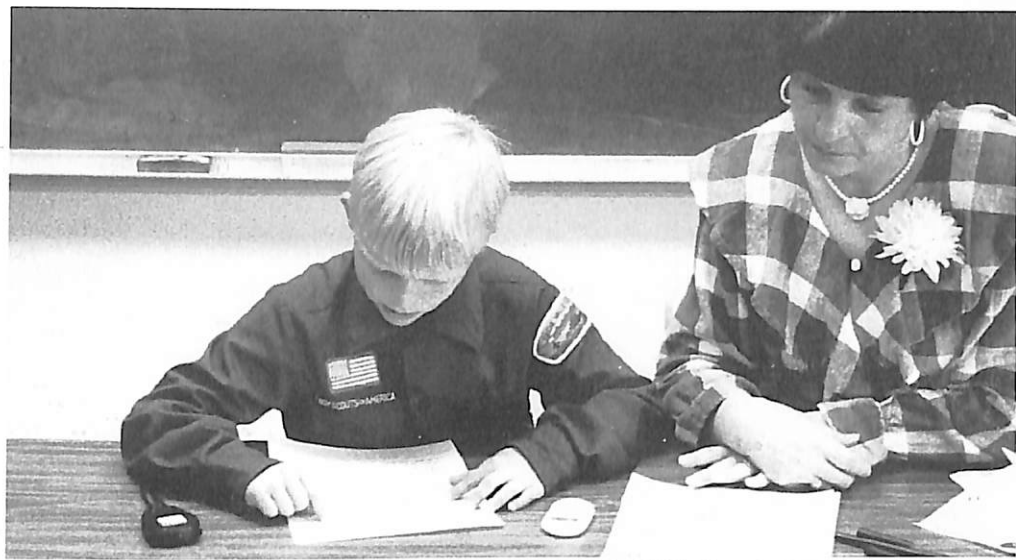

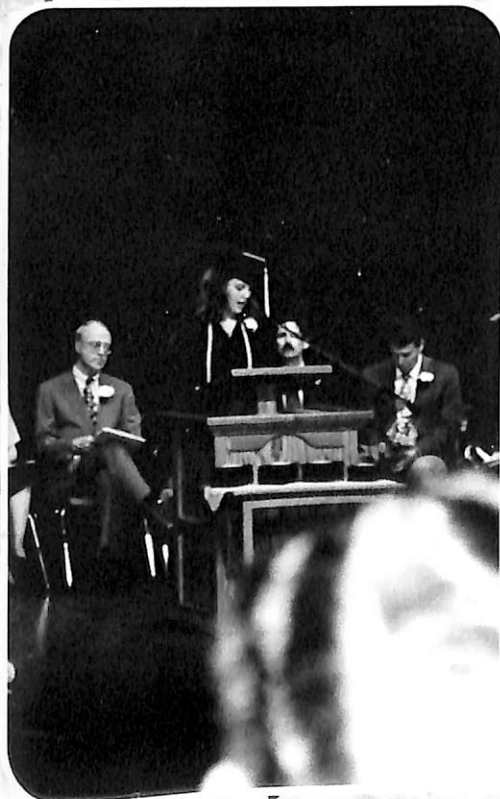
